
## PURPOSE

## CHAIRS REPORT

*It is hard to believe that it is now eight years since we announced our inaugural Women's Hall of Fame inductees on the centenary of International Women's Day in 2011. Since then the WA Women's Hall of Fame has celebrated and acknowledged 183 remarkable and inspiring Western Australian women, who have each made significant contributions to Western Australia's community, culture and history.*

Since the 2017 event, on July 1 2017 the WA Women's Hall of Fame became incorporated as a not for profit association and held our first General Meeting in December 2017. This will enable us to grow our vision as the opportunity demands via a more expansive alumni program and related community projects. Our ability to continue and grow the Hall of Fame is made possible by the ongoing support of our sponsors. I sincerely thank Lotterywest and the Department for Communities for allowing us to pay respect to and acknowledge the important role of women in Western Australia. Having been associated with Hall of Fame since the inaugural event in 2011 I was honored to be appointed Chair of the WA Women's Hall of Fame Committee. Many thanks to Anne Banks-McAlister for her leadership as Chair of the collaboration since 2010 and Deputy Chair Carol Theobald.

A key achievement this year was the development of our 2018-2021 Strategic Plan and developing foundation policies and procedures to ensure good governance and the organisations future growth and capacity. Thanks to the Ishaar Multicultural Women's Health Services for their ongoing support as our partners in securing funding from Lotterywest and the Department of Communities. By 2020, the 10th Anniversary of the WA Women's Hall



of Fame, the association will be in a position to secure sponsors as an established incorporated body. Actively engaging with our Alumni Inductees and the broader community to continue to grow the membership.

## KEY RESULT AREAS

### 1. Annual recognition of new inductees into the Hall of Fame

#### *Outcomes:*

- Achieve strong interest and high number of quality nominations for new Hall of Fame inductees
- Deliver a high-profile and successful annual signature presentation ceremony at which the new inductees are honoured.
- A robust and transparent judging process in place

### 2. Community awareness and engagement about the contribution of women to Western Australia

#### *Outcomes:*

- Enhance the website as the primary platform for WA Woman's Hall of Fame and increase social media engagement
- Work towards an enduring memorial, a 'physical manifestation' of the Hall of Fame by 2021
- WA Women's Hall of Fame included in the WA School Curriculum
- Increase the number of women nominated for WA and national awards
- Establish collaborative relationships with other groups to promote women's achievements & gender equity
- Engage alumni with WHOF as brand ambassadors, mentors and sponsors

### 3. Organisational development

#### *Outcomes*

- Develop good governance structures and processes
- Achieve sufficient funding to hold annual event and seed fund the following year's event. (Also see KRA 1, outcome 2)
- Develop human resources
- Increase membership

## 2018 WA WOMEN'S HALL OF FAME INDUCTION CEREMONY

---

*The induction ceremony was held at Government House Ballroom. It was a morning event, held from 10:30am to 12 noon. Noongar Elder, Ms Glenda Kickett provided a warm and inclusive Welcome to Country and the Honorable Simone McGurk, Minister for Child Protection; Women's Interests; Prevention of Family and Domestic Violence; Community Services opened the ceremony. Additionally, producer Melenie Ambrose produced another popular event conclusion with a video of inductees. The film is of itself, and together with those produced annually from 2011, is an important record of the achievements of WA women.*

The World Economic Forum's 2017 Global Gender Gap Report findings tells us that gender parity is over 200 years away. That is unacceptable. On the evening of the event a number of Perth landmarks will glow purple in honour of International Women's Day, the WA Women's Hall of Fame and this extraordinary group.

Including:

- Parliament House
- The Bell Tower
- Perth Concert Hall
- Trafalgar Bridge
- Elizabeth Quay

Of course, it will take more than a purple glow to create gender equity but we appreciate these iconic Perth venues' symbolic support. With your support, we can turn two hundred years into twenty.

The International Women's Day WA Facebook account was used as a primary means of communicating with women around WA and beyond [www.facebook.com/InternationalWomensDayWA](http://www.facebook.com/InternationalWomensDayWA). The page name was amended to WA Women's Hall of Fame to reflect the organizational structure and for ease of online searches. The focus on multicultural nominations set the tone of paid and organic posts. An emphasis was placed on video posts with simple Facebook animations featuring diverse women in everyday settings. These posts were key to the growth in page followers of more than 30% year on year. Critically, this took the page over the 1,000-follower benchmark. In turn, this fresh plateau ensured custom videos required relatively low budgets to meet a wide audience. Video also proved to be a successful approach in targeting the multicultural community images of ethnically diverse women were used in all applications.

Particular emphasis was placed on integrating the event's publicity with online posts. Links to radio interviews and print articles proved to be a highly effective mechanism to boost page followers and reinforced key messages. As incoming Chair, I did a number of radio interviews and the campaign was significantly expanded to regional WA. Thanks, in particular to Gina Church, for her work ensuring a such a successful 2018 media campaign.
